Hello all! My family and I are doing well, and I hope all of yours are as well. God is good, always! Tomorrow is Mother's Day, I wanted to take a time to say "Happy Mother's Day" to all you mothers! Motherhood is one of the most important jobs that God can give us to raise his children the way he wants as Christian women to lead them in His path. John 19:26-27 When Jesus saw his mother there, and with the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to her "Woman, here is your son," and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home. Jesus truly loved his mother and wanted someone who he trusted, John, to take care of her when he departs from earth. I grew up in a small mountain town in Tennessee near the Kentucky line. My father was in the army and we moved around a lot. We used to live in Germany, that's when I lost my hearing and so we moved back to TN. My paternal aunt was a strong Southern Baptist Christian woman who took me to church, I was baptized at age 8, but I did not understand what it meant. My husband and I went to T.S.D. (Tennessee School of the Deaf) together but we didn't date until He went to Gallaudet, and then on his break from Gally, we started dating. 4 years later, we got married. Even though he came from a strong Christian home, we didn't go to church. When our oldest child decided he wanted to go to church, he went with a friend. Soon after, he started asking us many questions about God that we couldn't answer so we decided to start finding a church to go to as a family. We attended First Baptist Church of Knoxville and for about 6 months, during one of the Wednesday's bible study led by Rev. Greg Johannsen. He was teaching us about John 14:6, that Jesus is the way and the truth, and that no one can go to the Father except through Jesus. I was blown away! So I was baptized again at the age of 37. I am forever grateful that God is in our lives. Now that we are living in an uncertain time, everything has changed. The last few months, in which I believe is now our new "normal", everyone's lives have been impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic. I have a verse I would love to share with you all. OUR HISTORY

SBCD was first met at First Baptist Church in Memphis, Tennessee in December of 1948. It was called "Baptist Workers Conference for the Deaf". Messengers traveled by train from Texas, Georgia, North Carolina, Kentucky, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Tennessee. In 1951, it was printed for the program, "Southwide Conference of Baptist Deaf". In the same year, it was "Southwide Baptist Conference for the Deaf". In early 1952, some people said "Southern Baptist Conference of the Deaf". It was clearly that the name was officially changed to "Southern Baptist Conference of the Deaf" on June 12, 1954 and it has carried the name of our organization ever since.

DID YOU KNOW?

Dean Pritchard was the first deaf woman elected as president of Southern Baptist Conference of the Deaf (SBCD) in Ridgecrest in North Carolina in 1975. Pritchard led a conference in Richmond, Virginia in 1976 and then led a conference in Glorieta, New Mexico in 1977. She served as president, secretary, treasurer, and Board of Trustees (now Board of Directors). Dean Pritchard also served in Education Committee, Time and Place Committee, and led workshops for SBCD as well. Pritchard was elected as secretary at the first annual meeting of Florida Baptist Conference of the Deaf (FBCD) at First Baptist Church of Tallahassee in 1959. She also was the first deaf woman elected as president of FBCD at Delaney Street Baptist Church in Orlando in 1967. She was elected as president of FBCD 5 times and SBCD 2 times.



Pritchard served as president, 1st vice president, 2nd vice president, secretary, treasurer, advisor, and served in By-Laws Committee for FBCD. She served for SBCD and FBCD for many years until her death. She was the strongest Christian leader that SBCD and FBCD ever know. In 1969, Pritchard suggested that FBCD send a delegate to SBCD since FBCD have never done that before and with \$1,000.00 given by Florida Baptist Convention (FBC). "We should pay at least part of the expense of a delegate". Motion was made that the matter be left up to those officers to decide. Motion was duly seconded and carried.

Born in Lake City, Florida on October 22, 1930. She lost her hearing when she was 8 years old. She accepted Jesus as her personal Savior at the age of 11 and then sensed God's call to Christian service about a year later. Pritchard believed her deafness is God's gift to help her reach out to other people. Pritchard was appointed by governor Reubin Askew for a term as trustee for Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind (FSDB). She was regularly active as a Sunday school teacher at Arlington Baptist Church in Jacksonville. Pritchard never seemed to tire of seeking to reach people for Christ and make disciples wherever she was. She received many awards and recognitions for her faithful service to God from Florida Baptist Convention (FBC) and Southern Baptist Convention (SBC). She lived in Jacksonville for several years. Dean Pritchard died at the age of 80 on April 1, 2011 in Jacksonville, Florida.
