

SBCD was first met at First Baptist Church in Memphis, Tennessee in December of 1948. It was called "Baptist Workers Conference for the Deaf". Messengers traveled by train from Texas, Georgia, North Carolina, Kentucky, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Tennessee. In 1951, it was printed for the program, "Southwide Conference of Baptist Deaf". In the same year, it was "Southwide Baptist Conference for the Deaf". In early 1952, some people said "Southern Baptist Conference of the Deaf". It was clearly that the name was officially changed to "Southern Baptist Conference of the Deaf" on June 12, 1954 and it has carried the name of our organization ever since.

DID YOU KNOW?



Lillian Beard was born on October 18, 1908 in Fort Worth, Texas. Beard was adopted by Deaf parents. In 1924, Beard began interpreting for Deaf attendees at First Baptist Church in Houston, which later became Woodhaven Baptist Deaf Church. She interpreted for the church for over 50 years. She was well known by everyone as "Miss Lillian". At the age of 15, she work for the Houston Lighting and Power Company to help provides her family. She also served as secretary for First Baptist Church of Houston from 1932 to 1942. Beard was a founding member of Houston Registry of Interpreters, the Texas Society of the Deaf, the National Registry of Interpreters, and the Southern Baptist Conference of the Deaf.

Beard held the highest certification for an interpreter from National Association of the Deaf and Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf. In 1995, Beard was recognized by International Mission Board for her efforts on behalf of Deaf Southern Baptists and for her untiring efforts to advocate for the need of Deaf Missionaries. At 90, she went her first oversea mission trip and ministered Deaf people in Czech Republic. At 91, she was honored by the Texas Baptist Conference of the Deaf as the Dean of Texas Baptist Interpreter. At 100, Woodhaven Baptist Church established a multipurpose center to serve the entire Deaf community in Houston and Beard was named in her honor, "The Lillian Beard Deaf Connection Center". Beard was also a recipient of the Jefferson Awards and received innumerable interpreting awards. She has been married to Louis Beard for 49 years until his death. Lillian Beard died at the age of 101 on June 10, 2010 in Kingwood, Texas.

Association of Southern Baptist Interpreters for the Deaf 7/08 (A.S.B.I.D.) Policies and Procedures

Purpose

The purpose of this auxiliary committee shall be to provide training and information regarding the ministry and leadership skills of interpreters in the local Deaf Ministry or Deaf Church, in order that the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ might be made more accessible to Deaf people.

Meetings and Membership

ASBID shall meet annually, unless the chair notifies the members of any special meeting. Members shall be designated as messengers of ASBID. Said messengers must meet the same qualifications as those for SBCD messengers and be involved in a local Southern Baptist church.

Officers

ASBID shall have 8 officers: Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, Historian, Interpreter Coordinator, Deaf-blind Interpreter Coordinator, Nominating Committee Chair, and Program Chair. They shall serve from the close of the annual ASBID meeting in which they are elected, until the close of the next annual meeting. No officer may serve more than 2 consecutive terms in the same office. However, any officer may be elected to another office at the close of their term. No officer may hold more than one office at a time. Nominations for the officers may come from the Nominating Committee and from the floor. Elections shall be by majority vote.

Officers' Authority and Duties

Chair

- 1. Schedule and preside over the ASBID business meeting.
- 2. Report the activities of ASBID to the general assembly of ASBID
- 2. 3. Serve as a member of the SBCD Executive Committee, and attend the mid-year SBCD Conference Planning Meeting (winter).
- 3. Coordinate the distribution of ASBID funds.
- 4. Appoint an individual to plan and lead the ASBID fellowship/reception at the annual conference.
- 5. Appoint an individual to lead a First-Timer's Mentoring Program for the week of the annual conference.

- 6. Appoint an individual to work with the ASBID secretary to set up and staff a registration table near the SBCD registration area, at the annual conference. Serve as ex-officio member of all subcommittees.
- 7. Appoint an individual to advertise the ASBID business meeting, workshops, activities, etc. on the ASBID Yahoo group list serve.
- 8. Collect and submit to the "Together With SBCD" editor and the SBCD Program Chair, information regarding the ASBID workshops, reception, First-Timer's Mentoring Program, etc.
- 9. Ask the members if there is interest in having someone print an ASBID directory. If there is, then recruit someone to make a directory which shall be in the hands of the members some time soon after the conclusion of the annual meeting.
- 10. Appoint a Parliamentarian to serve at the ASBID annual business meeting.
- 101. Work with the ASBID Secretary to develop a report to be presented to the SBCD body during their annual business meeting. Give a copy of that report to the SBCD secretary.
- 1<u>12</u>. Attend the annual SBCD Officers Training during the week of the annual conference.
- 12. Appoint persons to fill vacant positions.

Vice Chair

- 1. Perform all duties as assigned by the Chair.
- 2. Assume the role of the Chair, in the event that s/he the chair is unable to complete the term of office.
- 3. Preside over ASBID business meetings in the absence of the Chair.
- 4. Serve as or appoint someone to serve as the yahoo group email list serve Administrator.
- 5. Be in charge of the physical arrangements for the interpreters' workshops, in coordination with the SBCD Local Arrangements Committee.

Secretary

- 1. Record the minutes of all ASBID meetings.
- 2. Provide copies of the minutes within 30 days of adjournment of the annual meeting to; the ASBID Chair, SBCD President and Secretary, and the "Together With SBCD" Editor.
- 3. Provide copies of the minutes to the ASBID messengers at the following year's conference.
- 4. Serve as chairperson of the Registration Committee.
- 4. 5. Give the ASBID Chair the following information for the auxiliary report to the SBCD business meeting:
 - a. number of people in attendance at the ASBID business meeting,
 - a. b. the new slate of officers.
 - b. c. important issues discussed at business meeting,
 - c. d. number of interpreting workshops offered during SBCD week,
 - e. number of estimated interpreting hours donated.

Historian

- 1. Select an individual to take pictures of interpreters throughout the week of SBCD, and at the annual ASBID business meeting.
- 2. Collect: statistic on the number of interpreting hours donated each year at SBCD, pictures of interpreters, and important documents. Compile these items, and preserve them in an album to be brought to SBCD each year.
- 3. Serve as the point of reference for questions regarding ASBID history.

Interpreter Coordinator

- 1. Recruit and coordinate interpreters for signing Deaf people, oral deaf people and hearing people in general meetings/services/emergencies of the SBCD and its auxiliaries.:
 - a. the children's program,
 - b. SBCD workshops,
 - c. ASBID workshop,
 - d. worship services,
 - e. Bible studies,
 - f. ancillary meeting of SBCD officers,
 - g. emergencies,
 - h. SBCD registration table.
- 2. Keep a record of all hours donated by the interpreters during the week of SBCD, and give ASBID Chair an estimated total number for his/her annual report to SBCD.

Deaf-blind Coordinator

- 1. Recruit and coordinate hearing and Deaf interpreters for visually-impaired people of all ages during the week of SBCD. (tactile, print-on-palm, close-range, tracking, and the Rochester Method).

 2. Keep a record of all hours donated by the interpreters during the week of SBCD, and give ASBID
- Chair an estimated total number for his/her annual report to SBCD.

Nominating Committee Chair

- 1. Recruit <u>2</u> 4 more people to <u>serve</u> join him/her on the Nominating Committee.
- 2. Guide the committee in:
 - a. prayer,
 - b. locating those individuals to whom the Lord directs them, to fill the 8 vacating positions,
 - c. secure permission from these individuals to have their names submitted for nomination during the annual ASBID business meeting,
- 3. Present the nominees to the body at the ASBID annual business meeting.

Program Chair

- 1. Recruit up to 4 more people to join him/her on the Program Committee.
- 2. Lead the Program Committee in:

 - a. informally surveying the ASBID members, to determine their needs,
 b. solicit workshop presenters who are gifted by God to teach workshops that will meet these needs,
 - c. work with the ASBID Chair to schedule workshops and assign rooms,
 - d. arrange for all workshops to provide R.I.D. -CEU's, if possible,

Program Chair

- 1. Recruit up to 4 more people to join him/her on the Program Committee.
- 2. Lead the Program Committee in:
 - a. informally surveying the ASBID members, to determine their needs,
 - b. solicit workshop presenters who are gifted by God to teach workshops that will meet these needs,
 - c. work with the ASBID Chair to schedule workshops and assign rooms,
 - d. arrange for all workshops to provide R.I.D. CEU's, if possible,
 - e. secure facilitators for each workshop. They will:
 - 1. introduce the workshop presenter,
 - 2. explain R.I.D. CEU process,
 - 3. have RID members sign CEU/ACET forms,
 - 4. distribute and collect RID evaluation forms,
 - 5. distribute "Certificates of Attendance". this process has changed.
- 3. Troubleshoot last minute workshop emergencies.
- 4. Thank the workshop presenters with money, a gift, or a thank-you card. The ASBID Chair will help determine the amount of money that can be used for this purpose. Chair ask treasurer to cut checks.
