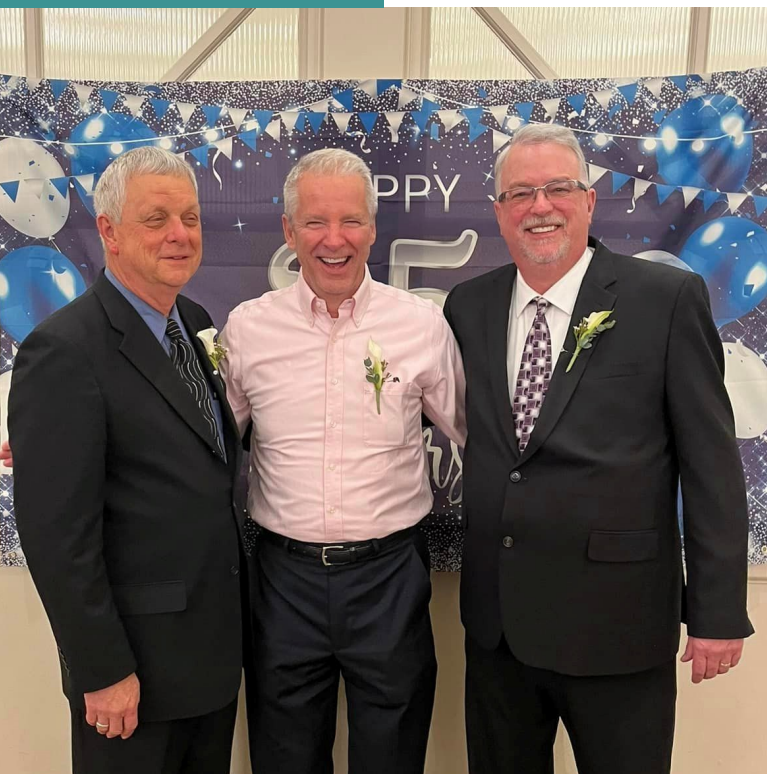

HISTORY OF SBCD

The first annual meeting was held at First Baptist Church of Memphis in December 1948. It was called "Baptist Workers Conference for the Deaf". Messengers traveled by train from Texas, Georgia, North Carolina, Kentucky, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and Tennessee.

In 1951, it was "Southwide Conference of Baptist Deaf" and also "Southwide Baptist Conference for the Deaf". In 1952, it was "Southern Baptist Conference of the Deaf". It was clearly that the name was officially changed to "Southern Baptist Conference of the Deaf" in 1954 and it has carried the name of our organization ever since.

PURPOSE OF SBCD

- 1.) To provide a vehicle for obeying the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) with respect to deaf people by personal witnessing, evangelism, home missions, foreign missions and discipleship.
- 2.) To provide opportunities for training in local church settings, in state conferences, and on the national level to help equip people in all aspects of the deaf ministry.
- 3.) To serve as a liaison between the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) and deaf persons, interpreting the needs and functions of the one to the other.
- 4.) To provide a channel of communication within the Southern Baptist deaf community.
- 5.) To provide an understanding of deafness and of the needs of deaf people to the community at large.
- 6.) To provide opportunities for inspirational worship experiences.
- 7.) To provide opportunities for Christian fellowship.

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." **Matthew 28: 19-20**

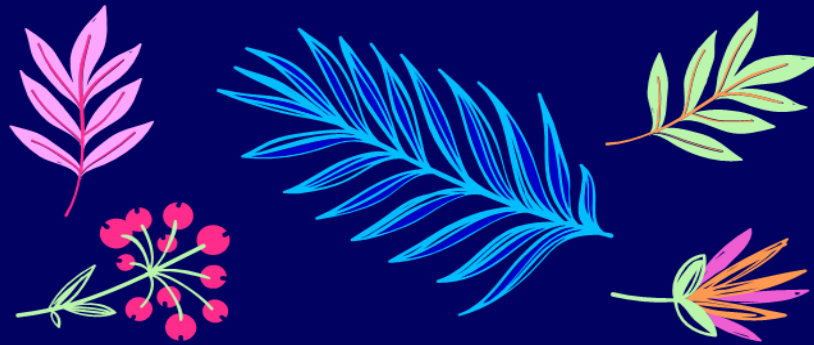

SBCD REMEMBERS



BEN COX 1925-2022

Ben Cox, well known as a faithful servant for many years. Cox served as Board of Trustees (now Board of Directors) for SBCD from 1989 to 1992. He served on the History Committee from 1988 to 1989, 1992 to 1994, and 1995 to 1998. He served on the Time and Place Committee from 1999 to 2002. He also served on the North America Missions Committee from 2002 to 2005.

Cox was born Benton Washington Cox, Jr. in Tupelo, Mississippi on September 3, 1925. He graduated from Mississippi School for the Deaf (MSD) in 1944.

Cox was inducted into the MSD Hall of Fame in 1995. After he graduated from MSD, Cox married his wife, Evelyn, on December 23, 1945. They were married for 64 years until her death on January 6, 2010. Cox and his wife accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior on June 21, 1951. They were baptized on June 23, 1951, at Calvary Baptist Church in Jackson, Mississippi. They have three children, seven grandchildren, and ten great grandchildren. Cox worked at the Commercial Appeal for 36 years. After he retired in the late 1980s, Cox led mission trips to Hawaii, Russia, Ukraine, Singapore, and Ecuador. He preached twice a month in Jonesboro, Arkansas for more than 10 years. He preached in Connecticut, Louisiana, Arkansas, Tennessee, Florida, Mississippi, Oklahoma, New Mexico,

Missouri, Michigan, Virginia, Texas, Alabama, Kentucky, Ohio, North Carolina, Georgia, and South Carolina. Cox served as President, 1st Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer for the Tennessee Baptist Conference of the Deaf (TBCD). He also served as publishing editor for TBCD called "Christian Volunteer".

Cox was a deacon for more than 50 years. He taught Sunday School at First Baptist Church of Memphis and Deaf Church at Kirby Woods Baptist Church in Memphis, Tennessee. He enjoyed spending time with his grandchildren and great grandchildren. His hobbies were collecting postcards, coin collecting, woodworking, and carving. Cox went to the 70th Anniversary of Southern Baptist Conference of the Deaf at Brentwood Baptist Church in Brentwood, Tennessee in 2018. Ben Cox died at the age of 96 in Franklin, Tennessee on August 24, 2022, 10 days before his 97th birthday. The funeral service was held at Kirby Woods Baptist Church in Memphis, Tennessee on August 31, 2022.

Cox shared his testimony about accepted Jesus Christ. His testimony was published in TWSBCD Volume 39 Issue 2 (2019-2020). "There was a missionary from Antioch Missionary Baptist Church in Little Rock, Arkansas. His name was Dick Jones. He could 'talk' in deaf signs. He came to St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Jackson, Mississippi, where the deaf gathered. That church allowed the deaf to use the chapel on Sundays. He shared the gospel with the deaf. I was there. I confronted him about God. I argued with him. Thank goodness he was patient listening to my arguments. I thought I was smarter than God! When he left for home, I felt so good. Again, he returned next time to town and saw me at the chapel. He said 'Ben, come over, I want to talk with you about Jesus.' Oh no, Brother Jones again! I thought. On the front pew, he patiently explained what the Scripture was. I finally discovered that Jesus died for me. His blood washed my sins away. I confessed my sins there. I became saved on June 21, 1951. My wife, Evelyn, became saved too. We were baptized on June 23, 1951, at Calvary Baptist Church on West Capitol Street in Jackson, Mississippi."
